Livingston County to Host Town Hall Meeting on Available FEMA Services

The public is invited to take part in a Livingston County Town Hall meeting regarding the federal assistance programs to help recover from damages caused by severe storms, tornadoes and flooding in August 2023. This will be facilitated by Livingston County Emergency Management.

On Thursday, March 28th a Town Hall Meeting will be held at the Livingston County Public Safety Building located at 1911 Tooley Rd, Howell MI 48855, from 5:30 PM to 7:30 PM. The public is welcome to hear opening remarks starting sharp at 5:30 PM. There will be an opportunity to ask questions of FEMA representatives regarding available assistance, the application process, and application status for those who have already applied for assistance.

FEMA will have representatives on site to assist with:

- New applications
- Provide updates on current applications – *please have your FEMA application number with you
- Discuss ways to better prepare for catastrophic events in the future
- Small Business Association loan process and the current limits and rates
- FEMA representatives will explain the National Flood Insurance Program
